Pastor's Words

Each year, on this second Sunday of Lent, we are presented with the Gospel of the Transfiguration.

Peter, James, and John accompany Jesus up a mountain. There they see him transfigured, his face becoming radiant with light, his clothes becoming dazzling white. It is a sight that is at once fearful to the Apostles, yet beautiful. They see Jesus speaking with Moses and Elijah, two great figures from Israel's history. They hear the heavenly Father's voice testifying on behalf of His Son. As Peter

But, come down from the mountain they must. They have seen Christ glorified, but the days are coming when they will see him bruised and bloodied, almost weak and powerless in hands of his enemies. The Transfiguration was meant bolster their faith in the face of what was to come.

Perhaps the Transfiguration can play the same part in our lives.

In the season of Lent, we keep the cross of Christ in front of us. Our Lord made it guite clear in his teachings that when it comes to the cross, we as his disciples will not simply be spectators to his sufferings. We will share in those sufferings. If we wish to come after him, we must be ready to take up the cross and follow him.

To be a disciple of Christ does not mean we will be immune to the effects of evil in our world. As I said last week in my homily, we experience temptations, we sin. We also suffer, sometimes horrendously, because of the sins of others. When we are battered, bruised, and broken because of the hurt done to us by others, it is easy despair. Seeing Christ glorified can be for us a sign of hope.

He, too, seemed to be abandoned by his Father while on the cross, but he never lost trust in his Father's love for him. While he suffered unfairly at the hands of the Pharisees and the Romans, he never stopped loving the Father, who loved him from all eternity. He never stopped loving those around him, praying even for those who put him to death. In the end, the Father raised his son from the dead. Love conquered death!

We can cause suffering for others, which calls for repentance on our part. We can suffer at the hands of others. That suffering does not have to destroy our capacity to love. If we can remember the Father who has loved us from all eternity, if we ask for the grace to see our sufferings as a share in the sufferings of Christ, perhaps we will not lose our capacity for love. If that love is in us, one day we will be raised up with him.

The Transfiguration was mean to bolster the faith of the Apostles in the hour of the Passion. Keeping our eyes fixed on Christ, seated at the right hand of the Father in heaven, is meant to be a sign of hope for us as we pass through this valley of tears.

RE Program:

Saint of the Week St. Gertrude of Nivelles:

Gertrude of Nivelles was born around 626 in present-day Belgium into a well-connected noble family. But she didn't stick to the script that most noble women were made to follow in her era: When she was 10, Gertrude reportedly refused - loudly and angrily - to be married to the son of a duke. In fact, she insisted that she would never marry at all. When her father died, Gertrude and her mother, Itta, moved to Nivelles (south of present-day Brussels) to set up a monastery, where she became an abbess. She became known for her devotion to scholarly and charitable works, and for taking care of orphans, widows, and pilgrims. She was also visited by spiritual visions and said to know most of the Bible by heart. But her ascetic lifestyle, which included long periods without food or sleep, took a toll on her health, and she resigned as abbess in 656 at the age of 30. She died three years later. Gertrude's feast day is March 17.
