Pastor's Words

This weekend's Gospel reading is the familiar parable of the Prodigal Son. While we focus on and identify with the son who leaves home, the real star of the story is the merciful and generous father.

He has two sons that need to be reconciled to him: the one who leaves and the one who stays. The latter son was probably meant to represent the Pharisees, to whom the parable was originally addressed. They considered themselves the righteous ones, but it was through their slavish obedience to the law. The Pharisees don't seem to see the generous mercy of God. They complain because Jesus reaches out to the tax

collectors and sinners. Salvation should be theirs.

In the parable, the older son is the dutiful one who stays at home, but he seems blind to the generosity of his father. The same father who gave his younger son his share of the inheritance would probably have done the same for the older son, but he never asks. His seems more of a slavish obedience to duty than a real love for his father. When his younger brother comes home, his sense of self righteousness will not let him rejoice at his return.

The star of the story is the merciful father who loves both of his sons and invites them both to come into his house and share all that is his. He is the merciful father who waited patiently and longingly for his younger son to come home and goes out to meet him when he does.

Of course, the father is our heavenly Father, who waits longingly and patiently for each one of us. How do we respond to the love of the Father who waits for each one of us? Perhaps the following prayer of St. John Vianney, patron saint of parish priests, can point us in the right direction:

I love you, oh my God, and my only desire is to love you until my last breath.

I love you, oh infinitely lovable God, and I prefer to die loving you than to live a single moment without loving you.

I love you, oh my God, and I long for heaven only in order to know the bliss of loving you perfectly.

I love you, oh my God, and I only fear going to hell because there I will never experience the sweet consolation of loving you.

Oh my God, if my tongue is not able to say at every opportunity that I love you, I want at least my heart to repeat it to you as many times as I take a breath.

My God, give me the grace of suffering out of love for you, of loving you while I suffer. Give me the grace of one day breathing my last out of love for you and at the same time feeling how much I love you.

The closer I come to my final end the more I beseech you to intensify and perfect my love for you. - Amen.

Saint of the Week

St. Maria Crescentia Hoess:

Crescentia was born in 1682, the daughter of a poor weaver, in a little town near Augsburg. She spent play time praying in the parish church, assisted those even poorer than herself and had so mastered the truths of her religion that she was

permitted to make her First Holy Communion at the then unusually early age of 7. As she grew older, she desired to enter the convent of the Tertiaries of Saint Francis. But the convent was poor, and because Crescentia had no dowry, the superiors refused her admission. Her case was then pleaded by the Protestant mayor of the town to whom the convent owed a favor. The community felt it was forced into receiving her, and her new life was made miserable. Conditions improved four years later when a new superior was elected who realized her virtue. Crescentia herself was appointed mistress of novices. She so won the love and respect of the sisters that, upon the death of the superior, Crescentia was unanimously elected to that position. Under her, the financial state of the convent improved and her reputation in spiritual matters spread. She was soon being consulted by princes & princesses; bishops and cardinals too sought her advice. Bodily afflictions and pain were always with her. First it was headaches and toothaches. Then she lost the ability to walk, her hands and feet gradually becoming so crippled that her body curled up into a fetal position. In the spirit of Francis, she cried out, "Oh, you bodily members, praise God that he has given you the capacity to suffer." Despite her sufferings she was filled with peace and joy as she died on Easter Sunday in 1744. Crescentia's feast day is April 5th.


