

**S** t. Bridget (or Brigid) of Kildare is one of the three major patron saints of Ireland along with Saint Patrick and Saint Columba. Saint Bridget's faith and labors for the Lord are remembered among the Irish people through prayers, sacred places, blessings and customs. St. Bridget was an extraordinary woman of faith: strong in her mission, loyal to the Lord, faithful to the Church, generous to the poor and hospitable to missionaries. St. Bridget laid strong foundations for the Church in Ireland. Her feast day is February 1st, the first day of the Celtic Spring.

## Раѕток'я Шокдя

"Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit dwells in you?" (1 Cor 3:16). Without this dwelling of the Holy Spirit in us we cannot "become Christ." "If anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ" (Rom 8:9). Grace and charity, which are the life of our souls, have relationship with the Spirit who dwells in us, because "the charity of God is poured forth in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us" (Rom 5:5). Even the resurrection of the flesh is a consequence of this indwelling of the Holy Spirit, who converts our bodies into his temple. "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, then he who raised Jesus Christ

from the dead will also bring to life your mortal bodies, because of his Spirit who dwells in you" (Rom 8:11). And the Holy Spirit does not come to us in a transitory manner; infinite Love is not a passing visitor who pays us a call and then goes away. He establishes in us his permanent dwelling and lives in intimate union with our souls as their eternal Guest. Jesus promised this to us on the last night of his mortal life: "And I will ask the Father and he will give you another Advocate to dwell with you forever, the Spirit of truth whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you shall know him because he will dwell with you and be in you" (Jn 14:16-17).

What delight in the thought! It is not because of the exigencies of his immensity, nor only because our wretchedness demands it that God establishes his dwelling in souls; love, which attracts, allures, and makes one overcome all difficulties, makes the God of heaven, who is in love with souls, come down to them and unite himself to them in an intimate and permanent manner. This is love: union or desire of union; and as the Holy Spirit is the infinite Love of God, to him is appropriated this happy name: "The soul's delightful Guest."

## Saint of the Week

### St. Paula Frassinetti:

Paula was born March 3, 1809 in Genoa, Italy as the only daughter of John and Angela Frassinetti. She was raised in a pious family; all four of her brothers became priests. Paula's mother died when Paula was nine years old. In need of a substitute mother, Paula turned to Our Lady. One of Paula's aunts moved in to help with the family, but she died three years later, and at age twelve, Paula took over as homemaker. Because of the endless chores at home, Paula was not able to attend school. However, each night her brothers would pass along what they had learned that day, her father filled in the gaps, and Paula actually had a good education. She attended Mass daily and prayed her way through all of her work. At age 20 Paula developed respiratory problems and moved in with one of her brothers in Quinto, Italy. When she recovered, Paula, with her brother's help, opened a parochial school for poor girls in the area. In 1834, with a group of like-minded young women, she founded the Sisters of Saint Dorothy (Frassinetti Sisters), a congregation dedicated to educating poor children. They soon opened foundations in Italy, Portugal, and Brazil, and were noted for their work with the sick in the cholera epidemic that ravaged northern Italy in 1835. The congregation received papal approval in 1863. Paula died June 11, 1882 of pneumonia following a series of strokes. In 1906, her body was found incorrupt. Paula's feast day is June 11th.
