St. Bridget was an extraordinary woman of faith: strong in her mission, loyal to the Lord, faithful to the Church, generous to the poor and hospitable to missionaries. St. Bridget laid strong foundations for the Church in Ireland. Her feast day is February 1st, the first day of the Celtic Spring.

Pastor's Words

I'm sure we have all seen this. Perhaps we have even had someone do this to us.

You go to a restaurant. You see two people sitting at a table. They are not looking at each other, but at their cellphones. Rather than being present to each other, they are more interested in things elsewhere.

If you've been on the receiving end of this, you know how annoying this is. You can't help but feel that you are coming in second to

something or someone else.

What if our prayer life looked the same way?

Our lives can be so full of activity that we find ourselves frequently multitasking, trying to do many things at once. Making time for prayer can fall into that category: I pray when I'm cutting the grass, I pray when I'm on the road, I pray when I'm doing this or that.

Don't get me wrong. If we're meant to pray always, then raising our minds and hearts to God at all those different times brings our human activities into the realm of the divine. Prayer can sanctify our daily duties, making them times when we glorify God.

However, is that the only way I pray? Do I seek times of greater intimacy with Jesus, when I can give him my full attention? If conversations between husbands and wives were always mere rundowns of what one was doing that day; if they were always quick, cursory things that require little effort or substance, how would they grow in their knowledge of each other? How would they get to know each other more intimately? Sharing deep, personal things does not happen on the fly. It only happens when two people are focused on each other.

Quiet time for prayer – quiet time for praying the rosary, reading the Scriptures, for spiritual reading – are essential for us. The quiet time is essential not only for speaking, but also for letting the Lord teach us. Silence – being alone with Jesus and praying with him – allows us to be more present to him, to learn from him. Silence is not a luxury in prayer, but a necessity. How else can we be completely filled with him?

This is why Jesus tells Martha that Mary has chosen "the better part." While the Savior of the world is in her home, while the Lord of heaven and earth has chosen to visit her, she puts all things aside to listen to him and learn from him. Are we willing to give him our all, or is he just one thing among many in my life?

Saint of the Week

St. Bridget of Sweden:

Birgitta was the daughter of a

Swedish Lagman, Birger Petersson and his wife, Ingeborg, who was a member of the same clan as the reigning family. Birgitta's family was pious; her father went to Confession every Friday and made long and arduous pilgrimages as far away as the Holy Land. Birgitta's mother died, leaving Birgitta, ten years old, Katharine, nine and a newborn baby boy, Israel. The children were sent to their maternal aunt for further education and care. From age 7 on, Bridget had visions of Christ crucified. Her visions formed the basis for her activity –always with the emphasis on charity rather than spiritual favors. She lived her married life in the court of the Swedish king Magnus II. Mother of eight children – the second eldest was Saint Catherine of Sweden – Bridget lived the strict life of a penitent after her husband's death. Bridget constantly strove to exert her good influence over Magnus; while never fully reforming, he did give her land and buildings to found a monastery for men and women. This group eventually expanded into an Order known as the Bridgetines. In 1350, a year of jubilee, Bridget braved a plague-stricken Europe to make a pilgrimage to Rome. Although she never returned to Sweden, her years in Rome were far from happy, being hounded by debts and by opposition to her work against Church abuses. A final pilgrimage to the Holy Land, marred by shipwreck and the death of her son, Charles, eventually led to her death in 1373. In 1999, Bridget, Saints Catherine of Siena and Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, were named

> co-patronesses of Europe. Bridget's feast day is July 23.
