Pastor's Words

This past Wednesday, I took Father Gaudfrey, our visiting missionary from Tanzania, to the Shrine Grotto of Lourdes and the Shrine of Elizabeth Ann Seton in Emmitsburg.

No matter how many times I have been to the latter, I always come away deeply impressed by the holy life of Mother Seton and with something new to ponder.

In this week's Gospel reading, Our Lord tells us, "Where your treasure is, there your heart also will be." These words invite us to ask a few simple questions: What is my greatest desire? What am I working for? What am

I longing for more than anything else?

For Mother Seton, the answer was simple: heaven. Elizabeth Seton's mother died when her daughter was only three of four years old. Mother Seton's father was a surgeon and often called away to work. It is said that even in such sadness and loneliness, the young Elizabeth thought not of earthly loss, but heavenly gain. She knew she had a Father in heaven.

Mother Seton's life was full of struggle and loss. She married William Seton, heir to a shipping company. They had five children together. She saw this as a very happy time in her life. Then her husband's company went bankrupt and he started showing signs of tuberculosis. During a trip to Italy, which they had hoped would be restorative to his health, he died while they were in quarantine.

In Italy, she met a Catholic family – business associates of her husband – and learned about Christ's presence in the Eucharist. Elizabeth -- Episcopalian by birth -- began wrestling with the idea of entering the Catholic Church. Her final decision caused great division among her relatives and friends in New York. So much so that when she tried to start a school, she was met with great opposition. No one wanted the "deluded" Elizabeth Seton to convert their children. Apparently, she did not always have the best business partners, either. Given the circumstances, her efforts failed. She was poor and widowed, trying to provide for her five children.

Long story short, she was eventually invited to Baltimore and then to Emmitsburg, where she finally realized her dream of opening a school. Even then, life was not easy. Two of her daughters died when they were teenagers, victims of tuberculosis. Two of her closest sisters-in-law also died of the disease.

Elizabeth Seton, herself, died of tuberculosis. The bed where she lay dying was near the chapel, set up so that she could see the tabernacle. Despite all that she experienced in life she never lost her devotion to the Eucharist. Her dying words to her sisters: "Be children of the church. Be children of the church." Despite all that she experienced in life, she never lost faith. Her husband and father were not religious men, but even they had a great respect for Elizabeth's burning faith.

When we read the lives of the saints – especially someone like St. Padre Pio – we often hear stories of miracles surrounding the life of that saint. Their lives seem so extraordinary that they seem unreal. God gives us those saints to show forth His power and love. But He also gives us saints like Mother Seton. I don't recall hearing any stories about miracles attributed to her in her lifetime, though there are miracles attributed to her following her death. These are what opened the way to her canonization.

All that Mother Seton had in life was a desire for and determination to be in heaven. Her life of charity was the fruit of her great love of God. These she kept through a lifetime of struggle and hard work. What is it we desire more then anything? What do we see as the goal of our lives? For where our treasure is, there is our heart.

Saint of the Week St. Stephen the Great:

Stephen was born in 977 to a Hungarian duke and his wife. After conclusively defeating an alliance of rival pagan nobility, Stephen used their acquired wealth to build a monastery, and invited clergy to convert the people. Stephen established laws favoring Christianity over paganism and sent an emissary to Rome with a request for the Pope to proclaim him as king. Pope Sylvester II accepted the request, sending him a crown and a gold processional cross, while also giving Stephen certain religious privileges. Greatly devoted to the Virgin Mary, Stephen had several churches built in her honor both in Hungary and outside the kingdom. Her intercession is credited with preventing a war between Hungary and the Holy Roman Empire under Conrad II and stopping an assassination plot against Stephen himself. In 1038, Stephen died on the feast of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary. Stephen is the patron saint of Hungary.

His Feast day is August 15th.
