Pastor's Words

It's hard to believe it has been almost two months since we all gathered for Mass. Many of you have told me how much you miss Mass and the receiving of the Eucharist. Watching it – even when live-streamed – is not the same as being there. This, of course, leads to the question of when we will be able to open again.

I wish I had a definite answer for you. The state governor has mentioned the possibility of opening some businesses next week. I know Bishop Burbidge is hoping churches will be included in that.

While we do not have definite answers yet, I have been giving some thought to how we'll handle things as a parish. One thing I am planning to do is add a 5 p.m. Mass on Sundays. Originally, I was going to stop the noon Mass once religious education classes were over and switch the time to 5 p.m. for the sake of summer vacationers. I am going to keep our three regular Sunday Masses and add the Sunday evening Mass, at least for the summer. My guess is that, even when we can have public Masses, there will still be social distancing requirements and possibly limits on the number of people we can have in the church. The extra Mass should give us a little bit more room to spread out crowds.

Bishop Burbidge is meeting with priests from the diocese as well as local health care experts to put together guidelines for opening churches. Keep an eye out on our parish website for updates.

In the meantime, consider that desire and longing you have the for the Eucharist a tremendous grace. On-line Masses are not meant to be the norm, and I think this weekend's Gospel reminds us of that.

Our Lord tells us two things: he is going to prepare a place for us in His Father's house and he is the way we enter that place.

To say Our Lord is preparing a place for us in His Father's house is to say that He is preparing a place for us in His Father's presence. That is the place he himself came from, and the place to which he tells his Apostles he is returning. Jesus's desire is that where he is, his disciples will be as well. His desire is that they will know the Father's love as he knows it and share his joy.

To say that Our Lord is the way to the Father is to say that we cannot share the life of the Trinity if, somehow, we do not begin sharing that life here and now. Jesus is the way to the Father because he took on our human nature in order to be able to communicate his divine life to us. When we receive the Eucharist, the sacrament of Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, we become, as St. Peter says in one of his letters, partakers of divine nature. As the Father and Son are one, we become one with the Father by becoming one with the Son in the Eucharist.

When we consider what we receive in the Eucharist, it should come as no surprise that so many are hungry for the sacrament, are longing for it. On-line Masses will never compare to the real thing. Through continued acts of spiritual communion, keep that desire and longing alive.

Saint of the Week

St. Isidore the Farmer:

Isidore was born at Madrid, Spain, in the latter half of the 12th century. When he was barely old enough to wield a hoe, Isidore entered the service of John de Vergas, a wealthy landowner from Madrid, and worked faithfully on his estate outside the city for the rest of his life. He married a young woman as simple and upright as himself who also became a saint—Maria de la Cabeza. They had one son, who died as a child. Isidore had deep religious instincts. He rose early in the morning to go to church and spent many a holiday devoutly visiting the churches of Madrid and surrounding areas. All day long, as he walked behind the plow, he communed with God. His devotion, one might say, became a problem, for his fellow workers sometimes complained that he often showed up late because of lingering in church too long. Isidore was known for his love of the poor, and there are accounts of Isidore's supplying them miraculously with food. He was favored with celestial visions and, it is said, the angels sometimes helped him in his work in the fields. He had a great concern for the proper treatment of animals. Isidore died May 15, 1130. His Feast Day is May 15th.
