The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast originated in France in the midthirteenth century and was

extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast is celebrated on the Thursday following the Trinity Sunday or, as in the USA, on the Sunday following that feast.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist.

At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

The Trinity, the Eucharist, and the Heart of Jesus


The greatest proof of love is the perfect gift of self. Generosity is essentially communicative, goodness is naturally self-diffusive. Thus does the sun shed forth light and warmth, thus do animals and plants give life to others each after their kind. So too does a great artist conceive and produce his masterpieces, so do the scientist and the scholar communicate their intuitions and discoveries and share their spirit with their disciples. In the same manner the virtuous man inspires others to virtue, and the apostle, passionately in love with goodness, gives the best of himself to the souls of his fellow men to lead them to God....

He who is the sovereign Good, the fullness of being, communicates himself as fully and intimately as possible by the eternal generation of the Word and by the spiration of the Spirit of love, as revelation teaches us. The Father, in begetting the Son, not only communicates him a participation in his nature, his intelligence, and his love, but he communicates to the Son the totality of his indivisible nature....The Father gives to the Son to be "God from God, light from light, true God from true God," and the Father and the Son together communicate to the Spirit of love who proceeds from them this same indivisible divine nature and these infinite perfections. Goodness is naturally self-diffusive, and the more perfect it is the more fully and intimately it gives itself.

[Thus] it was fitting that God should not be content merely to create us, and to give us existence, life, intelligence, sanctifying grace, and a participation in his nature. Indeed, it was fitting that God should give himself to us in person through the Incarnation of the Word. Even after the fall of the first man, God could have willed to redeem us in some other manner, for example, by sending us a prophet who would have made known to us the conditions of forgiveness. But he has done infinitely more: He has willed to give us his own Son in person as our Redeemer. Jesus, priest for all eternity and the Savior of humanity, also willed to give himself to us perfectly throughout his life on earth, particularly at the Last Supper and on Calvary. He continues to give himself to us each day through the Mass and Holy Communion. There can be no greater example of the perfect gift of self than these riches of the priestly and Eucharistic heart of our Lord Jesus Christ.

FATHER REGINALD GARRIGOU-LAGRANGE, O.P.

Father Garrigou-Lagrange († 1964) was a prolific Dominican theologian and spiritual writer. He was the theology doctoral advisor of the future Saint John Paul II.

Saint of the Week

Saint Ursula Ledóchowska

Ursula was born in 1865 to a Polish aristocratic family. Her family was full of faith—a sister, Maria, has been declared blessed after founding an order of nuns who served people in Africa; a brother, Vladimir, served as leader of the worldwide Jesuit community. She even had an uncle who was a cardinal! The family had been living in Austria after suffering financial trouble, but returned to Poland when Ursula's father died of smallpox. After his death, Ursula entered the convent and dedicated herself to the education of young people. After 18 years in the community, Ursula was named mother superior. She opened a home for women studying at the university in Krakow, which had not been done before. She was asked to provide similar help in St. Petersburg, Russia, by opening a boarding school for Polish girls living there. She established a convent there to sustain this work, and the nuns wore plain clothes because the Russian empire opposed Catholic institutions. Ursula and the nuns who helped her were often watched and followed. After the Communist revolution. Ursula and her community of nuns were expelled from Russia, and they settled in neutral Sweden. There, Ursula continued to educate girls especially those who were displaced by war or unrest—by starting schools for science and language. The community also started a Catholic newspaper and established an orphanage in Denmark. In 1920 Ursula made her way back to Poland with her sisters and dozens of orphans. During her work out of the country, her band of sisters had developed their own personality, and she established them as a new order in 1906—the Ursuline Sisters of the Heart of Jesus in Agony. Her Feast Day is May 29.
