

Father Haggerty, a priest of the Archdiocese of New York, is currently serving at Saint Patrick's Cathedral in New York City.





Saint of the Week

Saint Felicula

Felicula lived in Rome in the late first century. She was the foster sister of St. Petronilla; both were secretly raised as Christians by their parents. Felicula was living as a consecrated virgin—an early form of religious life for women—when the Roman empire renewed its persecution of Christians. After Petronilla refused to marry a powerful Roman official, both sisters were arrested. Soon, Petronilla received the crown of martyrdom, and Felicula was left with no food or water in her prison cell. She was ultimately thrown into a sewer, where she died. A priest, Nicomedes, risked his life to give the bodies of many Christians a proper burial, including Felicula. Her Feast Day is June 13.
